A New Beginning

Only yesterday we were making resolutions for 2024, and now, somehow, it is time to start again. Don't we usually make about the same vows every year? Lose weight, exercise more, keep in touch with friends and family etc. Here's a new one: "I will choose to sit at the front of the church."



It would be interesting to hear the reasons so many people consistently sit as far back as possible. Is it because they are shy? Don't feel comfortable if someone catches their eye? Want to get out as soon as the service is over in order to avoid all the cars racing to leave? Can't wait to go to breakfast?

I don't know who is in those seats because I am in the loft, but what I see when I look down is that the entire front of the church contains mostly empty seats. For those facing the congregation, it also looks like the church is empty. It's not as enjoyable to talk to empty seats, not as fulfilling as thinking one might actually be sharing thoughts and prayers with others.

Sound doesn't carry beneath the balcony. Those in the back are missing much of the richness of the vocal music, the beauty of the talented instrumentalists. How about trying a new beginning this year... up front.

The Bible probably doesn't say anything about sitting closer to the chancel, but it does have a lot to say about new beginnings. Isaiah says, "Do not remember the former things, nor consider the things of old. Behold, I will do a new thing, now it shall spring forth; shall you not know it?" In Corinthians we find, "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come. The old has gone, the new is here." Ephesians says, "Instead, let the Spirit renew your thoughts and attitudes," and James cautions, us, "Perseverance is the path to a new start because a new beginning often requires patience." And finally, a new beginning can start right where you are: Corinthians says, "A new beginning awaits anyone who is willing and wanting to make Jesus Christ the Lord of their life."

Since Covid, it has become much easier to sit at home and watch our church service on YouTube. It is a nice option for those who truly can't make it to church, but for others, it is easy to forget the warm and satisfying feeling of sitting with friends and relatives, all gathered for the same purpose: to worship together through word, deed and music.

Dear Brothers and Sisters of Dover First Moravian,

As we've entered this joyous Advent season, awaiting both spiritually and anxiously for the celebration of the birth of our Savior, we continue to pray for our congregation during the call process for a new pastor. The Eastern District Executive Board (EDEB) continues to meet, working diligently to fill the several pastoral openings in the district. While the Joint Board is in continuous contact with the EDEB, they have not been able to provide us with any potential candidates at this time.

While this work continues, we are pleased to announce that the Joint Board has entered into an agreement with the Rev. Dennis (Denny) Rohn, to provide part time pastoral services during the call process. We are fortunate to have Denny within our congregation, already being familiar with us. Denny has been assisting us during the past three months on an informal basis, so this formalizes his role. Once a pastor has been called and agreed to serve us, the agreement with Denny will end. Denny has agreed to be responsible for, but not limited to:

Leading worship at Sunday services for 2-3 Sundays per month, depending on the number of Sundays

Communion to homebound and nursing home resident members

Officiating at funerals, baptisms and weddings

Hospital visits

Pastoral counseling

Church office hours for approximately two days per week

Thank you for the support of the Joint Board and congregation during this time of uncertainty. Thanks to Denny for his willingness to work alongside us, as well as leading us. We ask that you continue to pray, support, and volunteer during this time, as we continue to do the work that our Savior Jesus Christ taught us to do.



By-Laws of the First Moravian Church of Dover: The duties of the Elders include overseeing the spiritual care and oversight of the congregation and its membership.
