Since 1987, MORAVIAN OPEN DOOR (MOD) has provided a temporary home for homeless adults in Manhattan, NYC.

This ministry provides safe and affordable transitional housing for 40 homeless adults, currently 52 to 91 years old. MOD provides a healthful breakfast and supportive social services to rebuild our residentsqlives. MOD helps them to obtain jobs and benefits, with the goal of finding permanent affordable housing and learning the life skills to maintain it.

Residents at Moravian Open Door pay a small monthly fee for their room and services (often much of their limited income); this covers only about 50% of the operating costs for the facility and its full-time staff of three.

Moravian Open Door *receives no government funds*. Donations from individuals, congregations, and other private sources must cover the rest of operating expenses.


We have several Advent study and fellowship opportunities this season. We hope that one of them will fit your schedule and feed your faith as we prepare to welcome the Christ child.





